

Information about semi-final exam  
for the students of AOKELT226\_1A and AOKELT466\_1A courses  
Faculty of Medicine (2018/2019)

Completion of Medical Physiology I. requires taking a semi-final exam in the examination period. The exam cannot be taken if the student fails to obtain the end-term signature and/or the lab reports are not signed by the practice teacher. The attendance of a minimum of 75% of practices (including seminars) is necessary for the end-term signature. Requirements of the semi-final exam: material of the Medical Physiology I.

Registration for the exam must be recorded through the NEPTUN system. Modification in the registration must be recorded through the NEPTUN system not later than 48 hours before the start of the exam. We would like to draw your attention to the fact that the teachers (including the Course Director and the Tutor) cannot modify your registration, so the registration, de-registration, modification of the exam date must be recorded through the NEPTUN system in time (not later than 48 hours before the start of the exam)!

Lab grade: Evaluating the work of the student is based on his/her classroom tests and performance practice in the regular period of the semester. The average of the best written tests (number of the tests in this semester minus three) and one percentage based on your activity in practices and seminars results a five-point scale:

**0-54% = 1, 55-64% = 2; 65-74% = 3, 75-84% = 4, 85-100% = 5.**

This grade is the lab grade and taken into account in the exams.

The semi-final exam is oral exam. The exam starts at 8:45 by showing up in the selected exam place. Your exam place and examiners are announced in written form at 8:30 (attached to the front door of the corridor of the Physiology Practice Rooms). The students need to bring ID card and the laboratory report book to participate in the exam. The oral exam consists of two theoretical questions (I-II). Grouping of questions (The topics of the semifinal exam can be found in <http://semmelweis.hu/elettan/files/2014/06/semifinal-oral-exam-topics.pdf>

I: 1 and 2 topics of the semifinal exam

II: 3, 4 and 5 topics of the semifinal exam

The overall result of the oral exam is based on the two theoretical grades and the lab work grade but a failed (1) theoretical question results in an overall failed (1) exam. The mathematical average of three partial grades (lab grade and two oral exam grades) gives the grade of the final exam:

<b>Excellent (5):</b>	<b>4.51 - 5.00</b>
<b>Good (4):</b>	<b>3.51 - 4.50</b>
<b>Satisfactory (3):</b>	<b>2.51 - 3.50</b>
<b>Pass (2):</b>	<b>2.00 - 2.50</b>
<b>Fail (1):</b>	<b>below 2.00 or in case of failed (1) theoretical question.</b>

The following rules will be enforced during the exams: electronic devices must be kept in the baggage; baggage and overcoats should be placed next to the wall of the lecture halls or the practice rooms; any form of communication is disallowed; students not complying with these rules will be disqualified immediately.

Repetition of the exam is possible at least three days after the unsuccessful trial.
