




## 1st meeting – Vienna, Nov. 20<sup>th</sup> – 22<sup>nd</sup>

### **Evidence Based Practice**




### Discussion about the overall aim of documentation and measurement

Documentation should serve the view towards the overall aim; should help to evaluate, if we are on a good way towards participation or if we have to change direction/measures/provisions.

But documentation is also needed to justify our work, to create comparable data. Different requirements, laws, regulations demand measurement and documentation.

Lots of tests are in use, but what are we going to benefit from all these data?



## Decision about how to continue:

- 1. In order to have a clear conception of the people we are talking about, some kind of **simple classification** (easy to handle, no sophisticated tests) could be helpful
  - $\rightarrow$  common standards, common wording

Speech, communication	CFCS	Communication Function Classification System
