COMPETITION ANNOUNCEMENT

We invite participants to the annual departmental competition held during the 12th and 13th weeks of the present semester.

PREREQUISITE: successful semifinal examination in Anatomy 3

(i.e., CV students are not eligible to participate)

First round (written test)

Place and time: May 4 (Friday) at 17.30 in the Lenhossék lecture room.

Topics: the entire subject matter of the 4 semesters

The content is composed of Macroscopy (45%), Histology (45%) and Embryology (10%). You will have to identify selected organs/cells/structures labelled by numbers on projected slides. In certain cases there will be short questions concerning the theoretical relevances of the labelled item. The answers will have to be written by hand on an answer sheet.

Anonimity of the participants will be ensured by the use of numerical codes.

Preregistration is open at https://doodle.com/poll/xvdw3ed97fxnhhf7 (It is only to calculate with an approximate number of the possible participants but means no obligation. Those who do not wish to participate should not sign up.)

Second round (Macroscopy pin test)

It will be open only to those reaching at least 70% in the written part.

Place and time: Anatomy Museum (presumably) and during Week 13. Exact time is TBA.

PRIZES - 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes are awarded to students achieving the three highest scores (sum of the two rounds). Further participants achieving at least 70% in both rounds will be decorated with a diploma and will be entitled to certain exemptions.

EXEMPTIONS - Exemptions are offered only from the practical (i.e. Macroscopy and/or Histology) parts of the final examination while the theoretical (written test) part is obligatory for everybody. *Please note, that the oral question in Maxillofacial Anatomy cannot be won as an exemption.*

Histology - Students achieving between 70 - 79,99% in this section are exempted from the Histology part of the final examination with a 4 (good), while those reaching 80% or higher will be awarded with a 5 (excellent).

Macroscopy - Students reaching 70 - 79,99% in this section are exempted from the relevant part of the final examination with a 4 (good), while those reaching 80% or higher will be awarded with a 5 (excellent).
