The 2nd Histology midterm is held during the 2nd (Thursday/Friday) laboratory classes of Week 11 (April 21-22). This week you are going to prove your knowledge in the field of Organ Histology. The same conditions and rules apply as with the 1st midterm test.

Topic:

Histology of organs/organ systems, except for those of the genital tract

(slides of the practical classes between weeks 6 and 11 - together with relevant theoretical background)

Form and content: 20 questions (images and theory questions written in moodle) Please have your SeKA account user name and password at hand.

Time: 18 minutes

Short inspection is offered.

Please arrive on time to the practical class. Be there at least 5 minutes before the starting time. Due to seating difficulties only one of the two (3 out of 6) groups may write the test at the same time, the other 3 groups will have to wait in the main hall (at the stairs). Once the first round is done, the groups will leave through the side stairs and the other three groups will occupy the laboratories and write the test.

There is no study material planned for this day, so upon finishing the midterm you may leave. Participation at the midterm test is obligatory, in case of staying away (absence) there will be a next possibility offered to write the test during the 1st class of week 12 (1st retake date). The result of the test cannot be upgraded or "corrected" by rewriting the test, retake midterms are solely offered to students being absent from the midterm.

It is strictly forbidden to talk or otherwise communicate with each other during the test, the same rules apply as with the written part of the semifinal examinations. Mobile phones will have to be switched off and put away in your bags.

Please go through the **practice test** offered in moodle. I hope you will be successful with the midterm.

PLEASE NOTE - Students may earn an **exemption** *from the written part of the semifinal examination with a **4 or a 5 calculated from the average of the two written midterms**.

A mark 4 (good) can be earned if the midterm average is 4,00; while a mark 5 (excellent) will be earned if the average of the midterm marks is at least 4,50.
