Macroscopic Anatomy and Embryology II. - 1st retake of the 1st midterm (29 students, pin test)

Time and place: May 2, 14.00 during the dissection class

Topics: *Maxillofacial Anatomy (see in the Schedule)*

Microscopic Anatomy and Embryology I. - 1st retake of the 1st midterm (33 students)

Time and place: **May 2 at 11.20** in the Histology Laboratory (immediately following the class)

Topics: *General Histology, PNS, vessels (see in the Schedule)*

Macroscopic Anatomy and Embryology II. - 2nd retake of the 1st midterm (oral or pin test depending on the number of students)

Topics: *Maxillofacial Anatomy (see in the Schedule)*

Microscopic Anatomy I., 2nd retake of the 1st midterm (?? students)

Time and place: **May 9, 9.50/11.20** during or after the Histology class

Topics: *General Histology, PNS, vessels (see in the Schedule)*

Exam competition - Week 13 (NOT OBLIGATORY).

The Department invites the 32 students **having a 4 or a 5 form the Maxillofacial Anatomy midterm** to participate in the annual departmental competition. Successful students achieving **4 (75%) or 5 (85%)** at the test will be **exempted** from the written part of the final examination.

Date and time of test: **May 6, 2022 at 16.45**

Place: Digital Histology Laboratory (room 3)

Topics: *Macroscopic Anatomy and Embryology I and II.*

Competition format: 50 (*35 macroscopy +15 embryology*) simple and/or multiple choice questions written in moodle/50 minutes.

The first 5 competitors are invited to participate in the 2nd round consisting of a pin test (TBA, Week 14) to define the final order. The first three competitors are decorated with a diploma of merit.


Non-obligatory assessment – Week 14

Date and time of test: **May 11 (Wednesday) at 10.30 during the dissection class**

Topics: *Limbs and internal organs (except for the head&neck region)*

Exemptions: Students earning marks 3, 4 or 5 in the non-obligatory practical assessments may request an exemption from the relevant practical parts of the final examination. Here their marks will be counted in the result of the final examination upon successfully passing the written part.
