To ensure all people access to safe, high quality basic health care services is vital in reducing poverty and promoting peace and stability. All countries are facing socioeconomic, political, legal and other health management challenges along the path of achieving universal health care.

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This year's school focuses on **innovation in health care reform** and **innovation in health care financing** which will limit costs, while delivering high quality healthcare services. Particular emphasis will be placed on the preparation of realistic, comprehensive and balanced health policies, strategies and plans, and on the preparation of a quality, equitable, rational and feasible package of health services, with particular reference to the countries of South East Europe.

Director of this year's Summer School is Prof. Dr. Dušan Keber, former Minister of Health of Slovenia and long-standing Director of the University Clinical Centre Ljubljana, prominent international expert with extensive experience in this field, while the Co-Directors are Prof. Dr. Klaus-Dirk Henke, Chair of Health Economics and Health Management, University of Berlin, Prof. Dr. Ana Stavljenić Rukavina, Vice-Rector of the Libertas International University, Zagreb, former Minister of Health of Croatia, Prof. Dr. Miodrag Todorović, CEO of "Panafricare" Clinic and long-standing Director of the Seychelles Ministry of Health, and Prof. Dr. Jeffrey Levett, honorary Dean of the National School of Public Health, Greece, International Gusi Peace Prize Laureat. - Achieving consensus between demand and supply of services, as well as between government, service providers and the population;
- Preparing a quality, fair and affordable health care package;
- Implementation of health care packages;
- Ethical, legal and policy issues when defining health care packages.

School Organization

The lectures are held every weekday, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Apart from the theoretical presentations delivered by the lecturers, in the framework of each topic there will be panel discussions and case studies.

Upon completion of the School, the School participants will be provided with course handouts necessary for effective lecture attendance and study after finalization of the School, as well as all authorized presentations. In order to enable participants to master the lectures successfully, simultaneous translation will be provided.

School Certificate

Based on participation during the classes and acquired knowledge and skills during the work of the School, the participants will receive a **nationally** and **internationally** valid and accredited Certificate of the European Center for Peace and Development (ECPD) University for Peace established by the United Nations.
