3.1. Data required for communication:

Consent or refusal regarding photo/video recordings taken at the event for publication on the data controller's media channels

4. CATEGORIES OF PERSONAL AND SPECIAL CATEGORIES OF PERSONAL DATA PROCESSED

No special category personal data is processed.

5. DATA SUBJECTS

Natural persons who register to attend the event.

6. GENERAL DURATION OF DATA PROCESSING

From the opening of registration (July 8, 2025) until the conclusion of the event session (July 30, 2025).

7. DATA RETENTION PERIOD

Personal data will be retained for 5 years after the conclusion of the event to demonstrate lawful processing. Invoices and accounting data will be retained for 8 years in accordance with accounting regulations.

10. INFORMATION ON DATA SUBJECT RIGHTS

10.1. Right to information

Data subjects have the right to clear, transparent, and easily accessible information. Requests must be answered without undue delay, and within one month at the latest, free of charge unless manifestly unfounded or excessive.

10.2. Right of access

Data subjects have the right to obtain access to their personal data and one copy free of charge (further copies may incur a fee).

10.3. Right to rectification

Data subjects have the right to request the rectification of inaccurate or incomplete personal data without undue delay.

10.4. Right to erasure ("right to be forgotten")

Data subjects have the right to request the deletion of personal data without undue delay if:

- The data is no longer necessary;
- Consent is withdrawn and there is no other legal ground;
- The data subject objects to the processing;
- The processing is unlawful;
- Erasure is required to comply with a legal obligation.

If the data was made public, the controller shall take reasonable steps to inform other controllers of the erasure.

Exceptions apply where processing is necessary for:

- Freedom of expression;
- Legal obligations or public authority tasks;
- Public health;
- Archiving, research or statistical purposes;
- Legal claims.

10.5. Right to restriction of processing

Data subjects may request restriction of processing if:

- The accuracy of the data is contested;
- Processing is unlawful but erasure is opposed;
- The data is no longer needed by the controller, but required by the data subject;
- The data subject has objected and verification is pending.

11. REMEDIES

11.1. Right to lodge a complaint




