LEGITIMATE INTEREST ASSESSMENT TEST

concerning the processing of personal data for the purposes of registering participants for, and maintaining contact with participants of, the Biomedical Data Science Summer School and Conference organised by the Institute of Biostatistics and Network Science of Semmelweis University.

1. Legitimate interest of the data controller or a third party

By providing their personal data and registering for the event, prospective participants enable the organiser to ensure controlled access to the event venue (subject to room capacity) and to deliver event-related information to those intending to participate.

1.1. Lawfulness of the interest

The legitimate interest of the Institute of Biostatistics and Network Science lies in ensuring the appropriate and efficient use of the event venue's capacity.

1.2. Specificity of the legitimate interest

Pursuant to the Event Organisation and Event Security Regulations adopted by Senate Resolution No. 54/2023 (VI.29.) of Semmelweis University, the event announcement must include the date and venue of the event, its nature and official title, the category of participants (and, where applicable, information on its closed nature), the method of registration, and—if participation is subject to a fee—the participation fee.

1.3. Authenticity and timeliness of the legitimate interest

The Biomedical Data Science Summer School and Conference of the Institute of Biostatistics and Network Science of Semmelweis University will take place between 6 and 17 July 2026.

1.4. Legitimate interest of a third party

No third party is involved.

2. Necessity of data processing

2.1. Clear and explicit demonstration that the data processing is necessary and appropriate to achieve the purpose

Processing personal data is indispensable in order to ensure controlled access to the event venue, taking room capacity into account.

2.2. Assessment of the nature of the interests

2.2.1. Legitimate interest of the data controller

The organisation and conduct of the event within capacity limits, including the identification of participants for access control purposes.

2.2.2. Interest of the data subject

Participation in the event.

2.2.3. Nature of the personal data processed

Name, email address (telephone number, name of editorial office, type of media outlet, job title).

2.2.4. Alternative measures to protect the interests of the data subject

None available.

3. Assessment of the impact of data processing

3.1. Position of the data subject

An equal relationship exists between the data controller and the data subject.

3.2. Position of the data controller

The data controller processes the personal data of the data subject on the basis of a legal obligation pursuant to Article 6(1)(c) of the GDPR.

For any further processing, in accordance with Recital (50) of the GDPR, the data controller has assessed whether the purpose of the further processing is compatible with the original purpose of data collection. Following full compliance with all requirements applicable to the lawfulness of the original processing, the data controller considered, inter alia, the link between the original purposes and the intended further purposes of processing, the circumstances of data collection—particularly the reasonable expectations of the data subjects based on their relationship with the data controller—the nature of the personal data, and the foreseeable consequences of the further processing for the data subjects.

As the further processing could not be lawfully justified without an appropriate legal basis, the data controller determined Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR (legitimate interest) as the legal basis for such processing.

3.3. Relationship between the data subject and the data controller

A direct relationship exists between the data subject and the data controller.

3.4. Impact of the data processing on the data subjects in light of their relationship with the data controller

The relationship is based on mutual benefits.

3.5. Reasonable expectations of the data subject

The data subject reasonably expects that their personal data will be processed exclusively for the stated purpose and that they may request the termination of data processing.

4. Method of data processing

Personal data are recorded and stored electronically.

5. Information provided to the data subjects regarding data processing

6. Security measures

6.1. Limited data retention period

Personal data are retained until the withdrawal of the data subject's consent, but no later than five years following the termination of contact.

6.2. Restriction of access to personal data

Access to the data is restricted exclusively to the data controller and is ensured through a secure, closed online registration system.

7. Outcome and documentation of the legitimate interest assessment

7.1. Existence of a legitimate interest

The data controller has a legitimate interest in carrying out the data processing.

7.2. Assessment of the nature of the interests

Only those personal data that are strictly necessary for the purposes of data processing are processed, for a limited period of time, and subject to appropriate security measures.

7.3. Assessment of the impact of data processing

The data processing is necessary.

8. Result of the legitimate interest assessment test

The legitimate interest of the data controller in processing the personal data prevails over the interest of the data subject in preventing the processing of their personal data for the stated purposes.
