

INFORMATION FOR 6th YEAR MEDICAL STUDENTS

Should students prefer to do their rotation abroad, a Letter of Acceptance (LoA) needs to be sent and accepted by the Director one month prior to the rotations. LoAs arriving within a month of start could delay the rotation.

We are welcome you to join us for your paediatric practice at 1st Department of Paediatrics.

Please carefully read this short guidance.

On your first day of practice (Monday), please report to the Secretary of Deputy Director on the second floor at 9:00 am.

You will need to sign a Student Agreement before you start.

Then you will be rostered to different Wards to complete your practice.

Please make sure you bring your health record book and also please make sure you have the necessary COVID test or certificate of vaccination.

Please also make sure you will bring a white gown and a stethoscope with you.

During their rotations students need to attend and stay on the Ward that has been specified on their Rotation Certificate.

Please find below some important information about the paediatric final exam at 1st Department of Paediatrics.

Final exam needs to be done in person at our Department, and it consists of two parts, a practical and an oral exam.

This also applies to students doing their rotation abroad.

These exams usually don't happen the same day, as it depends on examiners availability.

The practical exam usually precedes the oral exam, which consists of patient examination (students own gown, stethoscope required).

After the practical exam rotation certificates need to be returned to the Study Administration Secretary at the 2nd floor. This can be done via email in case of abroad rotation.

The oral exams are designed to be done at the end of the 6 weeks paediatric rotation (this is usually one of the last two days.)

Students who have not completed their oral exam in the recommended exam period can book an exam date in another exam period.

The oral exam starts with a screening question, which needs to be answered correctly to proceed with the exam.

After that 3 topics will be provided for discussion.
