

Information about Final Exam (updated due to the Covid-19 crisis)

The attendance in minimum 75% of practices, including the consultations and lab practices held either on site at Semmelweis University or online, is necessary for the end-term signature and to participate in the final exam.

Registration for the exam must be recorded through the NEPTUN system. Modification in the registration must be recorded through the NEPTUN system not later than 48 hours before the start of the theoretical part of the final exam, in accordance with the § (4) of section 33 of the Study and Examination Regulations. We would like to draw your attention to the fact that the teachers (including the Course Director and the Tutor) cannot modify your registration, so the registration, de-registration, modification of the exam date must be recorded through the NEPTUN system in time! Failing to certify absence from an exam causes registering “absence” = “nem jelent meg” in the NEPTUN system.

The final exam will be only theoretical.

Theoretical exam:

Due to the Covid-19 crisis, the exam takes place in the Zoom system (online exam) in the regular exam period from 18th of May. The exam starts at 9:00 by logging in to the general Zoom link of the exam (use the Moodle page of the course: <https://itc.semmelweis.hu/moodle/>), and after the students get into the „waiting room”. The students will be notified (i.e. in form of chat or verbal message) about their exam assignment. The Zoom links of the examiners can be found in the Moodle page of the course. The students need to show their student identity card to participate in the exam. At the beginning of the theoretical exam, two theoretical questions (I. and II.) will be drawn.

I: 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 topics of the final exam

II: 6, 7 and 8 topics of the final exam

The received partial grades are announced at the end of the exam and recorded on the official exam sheet.

We would like to draw your attention that in concordance with the new regulations of the online exams in the Semmelweis University (R/5/2020th (IV.23.) RECTOR'S DIRECTIVE;

During the distance exam the student are obliged to be familiar with the above mentioned rules and regulations; students not complying with these rules will be disqualified immediately. Also, in concordance with the R/5/2020th (IV.23.) RECTOR'S DIRECTIVE that a video recording will be made of the exam in the Zoom application, which will be kept by the system for 3 days and can be used to check the validity of the exam (i.e. to check potential cheating). If the student or the Department of Physiology object to the grading or the validity of the

exam, the Department of Physiology reserves the right to keep and use the exam recordings until the end of the evidentiary procedure.

#### Grading of the exam

The mathematical average of two theoretical exam grades gives the grade of the final exam, but a failed (1) theoretical question results in an overall failed (1) exam.

Excellent (5):	4.51 - 5.00
Good (4):	3.51 - 4.50
Satisfactory (3):	2.51 - 3.50
Pass (2):	2.00 - 2.50
Fail (1):	below 2.00 or in case of failed (1) theoretical question.

In concordance with the new regulations of the online exams in the Semmelweis University (RECTOR'S ORDER No. R/4/2020. (IV.22.)) the grade of the final exam which is announced and recorded in the NEPTUN system can be changed. The grade can be invalidated if the student fails to show his/her signed lab reports or the attendance in minimum 75% of the held practices or the attendance in minimum 75% of the practices held in the intensive practical period in July or August is not fulfilled.
