The overall focus for the programme is the evolving European Health market and the challenges leaders are facing today.

## Key Features

The programme is delivered in five short modules in five European countries: The Netherlands, Hungary, Sweden, England and Portugal.

The content of the modules is grounded in theory, evidence and effective practice, supported by expert advisers, keynote speakers and opportunities to visit service delivery facilities.

## **Programme Delivery**

To maximize the learning across Europe and gain insight into the realities of different systems, the programme is delivered in five short modules in five different countries:

### **Module One 4 days**

2 - 6 February The Netherlands (including a introduction, in Brussels, to the role of the EU in relation to Health provided by the European Health Management Association)

### **Module Two 2.5 days**

31 March – 2 April: Hungary

### **Module Three 2.5 days**

2 – 4 June: Sweden

### **Module Four 2.5 days**

15 – 17 September: England

### **Module Five 3.5 days**

10 – 13 November: Portugal

Recognising the time pressure on participants, the total programme length is just 15 days. Optimum use is made of the time on modules and includes visits to healthcare and related facilities in each country. However, evenings are largely kept free from formal sessions, allowing plenty of opportunities for participants and faculty to build networks and have informal discussions.
