

Professor Ondrej Viklicky is a Professor in the Department of Nephrology and Transplantation at the IKEM (Institute of Clinical and Experimental Medicine) in Prague and a lecturer at Charles University in Prague.

He studied at the Faculty of General Medicine of Charles University in Prague and received his medical degree in 1991. He obtained a qualification in internal medicine and nephrology. In addition to his clinical training, he began his scientific work in 1996-1997 in the Nephrology Research Laboratory of the University of Essen, Germany.

This is when his scientific relationship began with the colleagues of Semmelweis University. After his scientific work in Essen, returning home, Professor Viklicky first became the deputy head of the department of nephrology at IKEM, then the head of the department. He is currently the head of the entire nephrology and transplant unit.

He was president of the Czech Nephrology Society from 2012-2014 and then vice-president of the Czech Transplant Society from 2014-2016. Board member of the European Society of Nephrology and Dialysis (ERA / EDTA).

He is a member of the editorial board of Transplantation, Case Reports in Nephrology and Urology, European Medical Journal - Nephrology and Frontiers in Medicine.

He is the organizer of several international conferences, including the Congress of Nephrology and Transplantation, which has been held every year since 2014, and as its main organizer, invites lecturers from Semmelweis University every year and supports the participation of young Semmelweis University professionals. In connection with his editorial activities, he continuously provides the opportunity for the colleagues of Semmelweis University to display scientific publications.

He has published a number of joint publications with Semmelweis University. He has more than 300 scientific publications, 4500 citations and an H-index 35.

Professor Viklicky is an honorary member of the Hungarian Nephrological Society.
