### **Instructions for Authors**

The *Developments in Health Sciences* (DHS) is an Open Access journal for original research papers, review articles, short communications, rapid preliminary notes, case studies and other sections (book reviews, calendar of events, conference reports and product news) on all aspects of health sciences and related fields in medical sciences and health care.

Papers are accepted on the understanding that the results provide novel approaches and new insights into the problem addressed and have not been published, submitted or accepted for publication elsewhere. Submitted article should be free of falsification and plagiarism. All manuscripts must be accompanied by a certificate signed by the corresponding author and all co-authors that they have seen and approved the final version of the manuscript.

Papers submitted for publication are subject to a peer review process. All articles are reviewed by two external experts. Papers accepted for publication by the reviewers are subject to editorial revision. The Editor reserves the right to modify the style and length of a contribution (major changes being agreed with the main author) and to decide the time of publication. It is the responsibility of the corresponding author to obtain written permission for quotations, and for the reprinting of illustrations or tables.

**Submission of manuscripts.** Authors can submit the manuscript via Open Journal Systems: <a href="https://submit.akademiai.com/dhs/index.php/dhs">https://submit.akademiai.com/dhs/index.php/dhs</a>. Manuscripts should be submitted in electronic version of Word for Windows file (.doc, .docx).

**Preparation of manuscripts.** Manuscripts should be written in grammatically correct English. Papers should be typed 1.5-spaced with 2.5 cm (1 inch) wide margins using 12-point Times New Roman. Pages should be numbered in sequence beginning with the title page.

Manuscripts should be divided into the **following sections**: Title page, Abstract (with Keywords), Introduction, Materials and Methods<sup>1</sup>, Results<sup>1</sup>, Discussion, Conclusions, Acknowledgements, Authors' contribution, Ethical approval, Conflicts of Interest, List of abbreviations (if any), References.

**Title page** must consist of the title of the manuscript which should be a concise and informative title (max. 20 words) followed by the name(s) (initial and surname) and affiliation(s) of the author(s). The corresponding author(s) should be identified by an asterisk (\*) and given contact details (address, e-mail, phone number) at the bottom of the title page.

**Abstract** (max. 200 words) should be divided into the following sections for original articles: Purpose, Materials/Methods, Results, and Conclusions.

The abstract should be followed by 3-8 **keywords** based on the Medical Subject Headings (MeSH), <a href="https://www.nlm.nih.gov/mesh/">https://www.nlm.nih.gov/mesh/</a>.

Abbreviations in the title and the abstract should be avoided.

**Introduction** should state the purposes of the work and provide an adequate background with the most important results and literature related to the topic.

**Materials and Methods**<sup>1</sup> must provide sufficient detail to allow the work to be reproduced. **Results**<sup>1</sup> should accurately demonstrate the findings. If appropriate, data can also be presented in tables and figures.

**Discussion** section should explain and underline the significance of the presented data.

**Conclusions** should briefly summarize the presented study according to the results and discussion.

**Acknowledgements** section should consist of all the personal and financial (supporting grants, funds) contributions to the submitted article.

**Authors' contribution** section specifies the authors' contribution and their roles in manuscript. Use the monograms of the authors.

**Ethical approval**: Studies submitted to the DHS must have been conducted in accordance with the Declaration of Helsinki and according to requirements of all applicable local and international standards.

**Conflicts of Interest / Funding:** Authors are required to disclose all financial and non-financial competing interest. All sources of funding for the study reported should be declared. Authors must state explicitly whether potential conflicts/funding do or do not exist. If no conflicts/funding exist, the authors should state: "The authors declare no conflict of interest" and "No financial support was received for this study".

**References:** References should be indicated by number(s) in square brackets in line with the text [1-4,5,17] in order of appearance. References should be listed in the 'References' section with numbers. All authors shall be listed in full up to the total number of six; for seven or more authors, list the first three authors followed by "et al.". Abbreviated journal names according to the National Library of Medicine (NLM) journal abbreviations list; <a href="https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/nlmcatalog/journals">https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/nlmcatalog/journals</a>.

**Tables** must be numbered consecutively with Arabic numerals in the text (Table 1., Table 2. etc.). They should be presented in a separate file in Microsoft Word format and provided with title.

**Figures** must be numbered consecutively with Arabic numerals in the text (Figure 1., Figure 2. etc.). They should be submitted in a separate file with title. Figures that include more than one image should be labelled as a, b, c, etc.

Charts, diagrams, schemes as "Figures" should be presented in Microsoft Word format. The requested format for *photographs* (*graphic files*): JPEG, TIFF, GIF. Photographs legends with brief titles should be provided on a separate page. Colour figures will be accepted; however the extra cost of reproduction in colour must be paid by the authors.

**Abbreviations:** All abbreviations should be defined at first mention and used consistently thereafter. Quantities should be expressed in standard international units (SI).

#### **Self-Archiving, Offprints**

The Author is entitled to self-archive the preprint version of his/her manuscript. The preprint version is the author's manuscript or the galley proof or the author's manuscript along with the corrections made in the course of the peer review process. The author's right to self-archive is irrespective of the format of the preprint (.doc, .txt, .pdf) version and self-archiving includes the free circulation of this file via e-mail or publication of this preprint on the author's webpage or on the author's institutional repository with open or restricted access. When self-archiving a paper the author should clearly declare that the archived file is not the final published version of the paper, he/she should quote the correct citation and enclose a link to the published paper (http://dx.doi.org/ [DOI of the article without brackets]).
