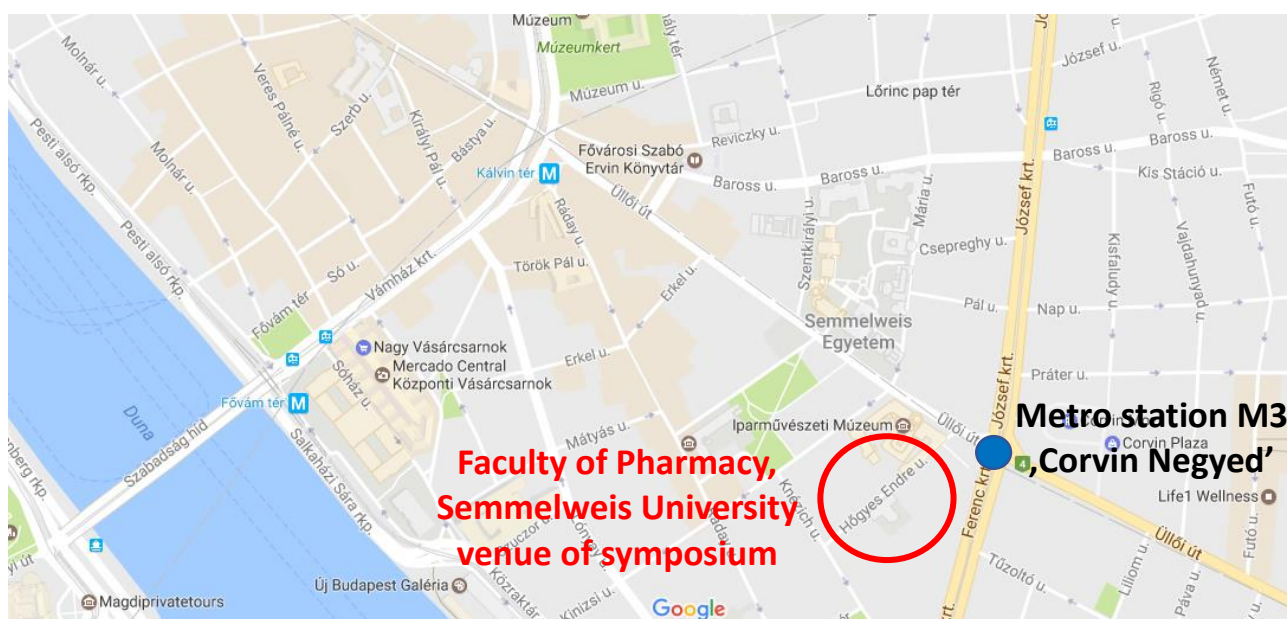

How to get there:

from Liszt Ferenc Airport:

**take bus #200 to 'Kőbánya-Kispest'
change to metro M3 to 'Corvin Negyed'**

from Keleti International Railway Station:

take metro M2 to 'Blaha Lujza tér'

from Népliget International Bus Station:

**change to tram #4 or #6 to 'Corvin Negyed'
take metro M3 to 'Corvin Negyed'**

General information:

Budapest has 23 districts. Public transport is developed and conveniently available throughout the city. There are 4 color-coded metro lines (M1 thru M4), in addition to several tram, bus and trolleybus lines. Single tickets (350 HUF) or ticket blocks (10 pcs for 3000 HUF) can be purchased at the purple ticket machines deployed at all metro and railway stations as well as at many tram stations.

Deák Ferenc tér is the safe destination in case you get lost during your trip. Three of the four metro lines intersect here, making it available from all areas of Budapest and a convenient point of departure.

A huge number of taxis operate in Budapest, all painted yellow and charging the same fares which are clearly displayed. All cars are equipped with POS terminals. Care should be taken, though, as some drivers are likely to waive the standard procedures, offering higher fares.
