To ensure a smooth running program, speakers are asked to check and submit their presentation in Speakers Preview room at least 2 hours prior to the start of their session.

Presenters should plan to be in the meeting room at least 10 minutes before the start of the session.

All presentations must be submitted in Windows compatible PowerPoint files on PC-readable CDs, DVDs, external disk drives, USB sticks or memory sticks at the Preview room.

Please note that projection requires all the presentations to be prepared in 4:3 format (1024 x 768). To avoid certain incompatibilities between PowerPoint for Mac and PowerPoint for Windows only images in JPG- or BMP-format should be used in their presentation.

If fonts are used in a presentation that are not available in Windows or PowerPoint, the varying fonts must be included in the presentation or enclosed as separate files for installation. Please note that PowerPoint never integrates video files into a presentation but rather only links the videos to it. Pre-Meeting Course Speakers

Geoffrey Rose



Geoffrey Rose graduated as Bachelor of Science in Pharmacology, with first-class honours, in 1976. He qualified in Medicine at King's College Hospital, London, in 1979 and subsequently gained experience in Internal Medicine with award of Membership of the Royal College of Physicians in 1982. Postgraduate ophthalmic training was undertaken at King's College Hospital, St Thomas Hospital and Moorfields Eye Hospital, with award of Fellowship of the Royal College of Surgeons in 1985 and the Royal College of Ophthalmologists at its foundation in 1988. In 1990 the University of London granted an MS doctorate for his research on corneal endothelial changes after cataract surgery and, in 2004, awarded him a Doctor of Science in Ophthalmology and Ophthalmic Surgery.

Appointed as consultant surgeon to Moorfields Eye Hospital in 1990, Geoffrey Rose has served as Director of the Adnexal Service, and is currently the senior consultant specialising in orbital and lacrimal diseases. The unique clinical case-mix at Moorfields has provided opportunity for widespread research interests and publication of over 200 papers and chapters on adnexal disease. He lectures widely at national and international level, has presented various named and guest lectures. In 2004, he was awarded the Lester Jones Anatomy Award of the American Society of Ophthalmic Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery (of which he is an honorary fellow). Professor Rose is a Senior Research Fellow of the Biomedical Research Centre of the Institute of Ophthalmology with University College, London.

For 8 years, Professor Rose served as the British Council member of the European Society of Ophthalmic Plastic and Reconstructive, and is Past-President of the British Oculo-Plastic Surgical Society.

He delivered more than 80 lectures in national and international events.

He is one of the founders of OPSE (Ophthalmoplastic Society of Egypt) and organized the first annual meeting at Maadi AF Hosp, 2009.

Dr. Assem is an active member of EOS (Egyptian Ophthalmological Society) since 1986, and elected in the executive board in March 2010, 2011.

In 2004 he joined the Moorfields Adnexal Group, and now specialises in complex lid and orbital disease, in addition to maintaining a broad interest in all forms of lid disease. Michèle Beaconsfield is Director of the Adnexal Service at Moorfields Eye Hospital and Clinical Lead for Lid Oncology. Her surgical subspecialty interests also include cosmetic rehabilitation of thyroid ophthalmopathy. She is one of the founding members of BOPSS (British OculoPlastic Surgeons Society), examines for the Royal College of Ophthalmologists and the European Board of Ophthalmology (EBO), and is immediate past president of the UEMS Ophthalmic Section (Union Européenne des Médecins Spécialistes) and Treasurer of ESOPRS (European Society of Ophthalmic Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery).

Bitia Esmaeli



Dr. Bitia Esmaeli is a Professor of Ophthalmology in the Department of Plastic Surgery at The University of Texas M. D. Anderson Cancer Center, where she has an orbital oncology and oncologic ophthalmic plastic surgery practice since 1998.

Dr. Esmaeli's practice focus is surgical treatment of orbital tumors, lacrimal gland carcinomas, eyelid cancers, melanoma of eyelid and conjunctiva, and reconstructive surgery in the periocular region including lacrimal surgery.

Dr. Esmaeli has authored over 160 peer-reviewed manuscripts, over 55 invited articles and book chapters, has spearheaded several clinical trials, and has participated in numerous research protocols at M. D. Anderson Cancer Center. She has received many prestigious awards and honors including the Merrill Reeh Pathology Award and the Research Award from the American Society of Ophthalmic Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, the American Academy of Ophthalmology Senior Achievement Award, Best Doctors in America, and Top Doctors Award. Dr Esmaeli was inducted as a member of the prestigious American Ophthalmologic Society in 2012.

Dr Esmaeli's research interests include molecular signature of ocular and orbital tumors, tissue banking for rare tumors of the eye and orbit, eye and vision-sparing treatment strategies for orbital and ocular cancers, and ocular and orbital side effects of cancer therapy.

Dr. Esmaeli helped establish the Ophthalmology Service as a comprehensive full-time service at M. D. Anderson Cancer Center in 1998. She served as the Director of the Ophthalmologic Services from 1998 to 2001 and as the Chief of the Ophthalmology Section at M. D. Anderson from 2001 to 2004. She is currently the Program Director for an ASOPRS-sponsored and ACGME-approved fellowship in oculoplastic surgery and orbital oncology at M. D. Anderson Cancer Center.

Brigita Drnovšek-Olup



She finished her studies at Medical School University of Ljubljana in 1979 and after having passed the state exam she worked as a general practitioner. In 1983 she started her residency in ophthalmology at University Eye Hospital in Ljubljana and passed the final exam in 1987. She finished her post-graduate studies in ophthalmology at the Medical School University of Zagreb (Croatia) in 1990 and in 1991 received her Master's degree (MSc).

In 1995 she received her PhD from the field of ophthalmic-plastic surgery at the University of Ljubljana.

Since 1985 she has been working mainly as oculoplastic, lacrimal and orbital surgeon. She has been a head of the Oculoplastic department at University Eye Hospital Ljubljana since 1993 and a head of the same hospital 2002-2009 and medical director of University Medical Centre Ljubljana 2009-2013.

Her scientific work include: leadership of scientific research projects supported by Ministry of Science, Republic of Slovenia. She performed preclinical and clinical studies of Er:YAG and diode laser and she has reported about her experiences on several scientific meetings and workshops in Europe, USA, South America and Asia. She is author and co-author of over 280 abstracts, articles in peer-reviewed journals and other publications.

In 1993 she was elected for assistant prof. in 1997 for associate prof. and in 2005 for professor of Ophthalmology at the Medical School, University of Ljubljana.
