

Dr. Gloviczki Péter

Dr. Peter Gloviczki the Joe M. and Ruth Roberts Professor of Surgery at Mayo Clinic, Rochester, MN. He is former Chair of the Division of Vascular and Endovascular Surgery (2000-2010) and former Director of the Mayo Clinic Gonda Vascular Center (2002-2010). A native of Nyiregyhaza, Hungary, he completed his high school education at the Arch Abbey of Pannonhalma and earned his medical degree at Semmelweis Medical University in Budapest, Hungary, with the distinction “Sub Auspiciis Rei Publicae Popularis”. He received his surgical training in Budapest at the Varosmajor Clinic of Semmelweis University, under the direction of Professor Lajos Soltesz, and trained also in Paris, France and in Rochester, MN. He joined the staff of Mayo Clinic in 1987.

Dr. Gloviczki is best known of his extensive clinical practice at Mayo Clinic, that includes many areas of vascular and endovascular surgery. He has a special interest in aortic, visceral surgery, aortic endografts, critical limb ischemia, carotid disease, reconstruction of large veins, chronic venous diseases, vascular malformations and lymphatic microsurgery. He authored over 520 scientific articles or chapters and delivered over 400 presentations, many at national and international meetings. The impact factor of his works are more than 1500, and the number of the citations on his publications are more, than 12 000!

He is a member of all major national vascular societies. He was president of the Society for Vascular Surgery (SVS) and the International Union of Angiology among others. He served on the board of several vascular journals and was recently elected editor of the Journal of Vascular Surgery. As book editor he is best known of 3 editions of the Handbook of Venous Disorders.

Dr. Gloviczki received numerous awards from national and international vascular societies. He has been listed in The Best Doctors in America by Woodward White, Inc.

He mentored 98 clinical and research fellows, including several from Semmelweis University. He maintained close ties with Hungary and organized joint vascular meetings with Hungarian colleagues. He was awarded Honorary Membership of the Hungarian Surgical Society, of the Hungarian Society for Angiology and Vascular Surgery and the Emerick Szilagyí Hungarian-American Vascular Society. He also holds Honorary Memberships in 12 national and international vascular societies. For his contributions to French medicine, in 2004 he received the Medal of the City of Paris. In 2014 he was selected for the George Washington Award of the American Hungarian Foundation.

Dr. Gloviczki has lived in Rochester, Minnesota, since 1981. He is married and has two children, Peter Jr. and Julia.

The Senate of Semmelweis University decided to award the title of Honoris Causa to Professor Gloviczki following on the proposal of Professor László Entz, Professor Ferenc Horkay and Professor Béla Merkely in 2014.
