who is the newest person to be nominated by the U.S. State Department as an American Public Diplomacy Envoy. Drescher began her acting career in 1977 with "Saturday Night Fever" and has co-starred in countless other films with some of Hollywood's biggest names. However, she is best known for her television sitcom "The Nanny" which continues to attract a world-wide audience ("A dadus," currently on RTL Klub.) In her role as Fran Fine in "The Nanny," she received two Emmy and two Golden Globe nominations.

In addition to her work as an actress, Drescher has made a name for herself as a writer of two New York Times best selling books: "Enter Whining," the story of her life from her childhood in Queen's to becoming a television star; and "Cancer Schmancer," which recounts her experience with uterine cancer.

Drescher has launched the Cancer Schmancer Movement, a non-profit organization dedicated to ensuring that all women's cancers be diagnosed while in Stage 1, when it is most curable. She also successfully lobbied for the passage of Johanna's Law, which promotes gynecological cancer education and awareness among women and health care providers.
