International Mentoring Program

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The aim of this booklet is to serve as a comprehensive guide for mentors participating in the International Students Mentoring Program, emphasizing mentorship best practices, academic support strategies, and resources available to facilitate student success at Semmelweis University's Medicine Faculty.



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INTRODUCTION OF THE PROGRAM

The International Students Mentoring Program at Semmelweis University's Medicine Faculty aims to provide comprehensive support and guidance to incoming students, particularly international students, throughout their academic journey. By fostering mentor-mentee relationships, the program seeks to enhance student success and facilitate a smooth transition into university life.

Prospective mentors must be third-year students or above and undergo an application process, including submission of a motivational letter and CV, followed by an interview. Successful completion of program requirements earns mentors 2 credits per semester. Application through our <u>website</u>, <u>email</u>, or through the application form. Registration through Neptun.

Mentors are expected to adhere to program regulations, including maintaining regular contact with mentees, updating logbooks, attending supervision sessions, and upholding professional boundaries. Non-compliance may result in consequences such as loss of credit points.

- Regular Contact with Mentees: Maintain consistent communication with mentees through weekly online interactions and at least two in-person meetings per semester.
- Logbook Updates: Keep detailed records of mentormentee interactions and submit logbooks by specified deadlines each semester.
- Attendance at Supervision Sessions: Attend scheduled supervision sessions to share experiences, seek guidance, and contribute to discussions.
- Professional Boundaries: Maintain professional boundaries and prioritize mentoring responsibilities over personal relationships.
- Consequences for Non-Compliance: Failure to fulfill program requirements may result in the loss of credit points and program eligibility.



WORKSHOPS, LECTURES AND SUPERVISION SESSIONS

Participation in workshops and supervision sessions is essential for mentor skill development and staying updated on mentorship techniques. Supervision sessions provide opportunities for mentor feedback and growth. Besides the obligatory sessions, we organize elective sessions and activities to help the mentors with their work and their personal development.

LOGBOOK GUIDELINES AND DEADLINES

Mentors are required to maintain detailed logbooks documenting mentormentee interactions and activities. Logbooks must be submitted by specified deadlines each semester to track progress and ensure accountability. You have to use a given template and submit it via Moodle.

TIPS FOR GUIDING FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

Mentoring in Revision and Exam Preparation

Revision Tips:

- Identify strengths and weaknesses by reviewing the provided topic list.
- Utilize resources such as Amboss (accessible through the university's email), Osmosis, YouTube, and recommended departmental books.
- Revise according to the topic list for each subject, creating comprehensive notes.

AMBOSS	An online learning platform to assist you throughout your medical career. It includes a Library and Question bank. (University Access)
UpToDate	Accurate medical articles with credible information. Can be accessed from home with the Semmelweis VPN! (University Access)
ANKI	Flashcards that you can personalize with a multitude of features such as spaced repetitions.
Osmosis	Access to videos that are condensed and easy to understand (Free Trial)

Other resources include Ninja Nerd, Kenhub (for anatomy) and Lecturio!

Exam Strategy:

- Focus on understanding structural concepts, formulae, and graphs, as these are frequently assessed.
- Approach oral exams with confidence, prioritizing clarity of communication.
- Practice active recall and utilize study techniques promoting organized learning and repetition.

Schedule:

- Collaborate with mentees to create a schedule, set goals, and develop a study plan.
- Emphasize preparation for the exam period well in advance.
- Provide strategies for scheduling exams effectively during the exam period.

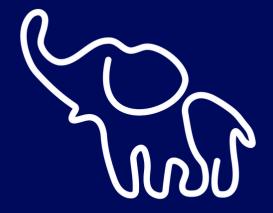
EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AND STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES
