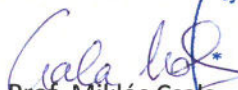

### CALL FOR TEACHING ASSISTANT (TA) FELLOWSHIP for the 2026/27 academic year

The **Department of Molecular Biology** at Semmelweis University offers teaching assistant (TA) positions for students in the **Faculty of Dentistry** for the **2026/27** academic year on the following terms:

1. Teaching assistants are required to provide assistance during laboratory (practical) sessions held by the Department of Molecular Biology for the following courses: Medical Chemistry and Molecular Cell Biology I (1<sup>st</sup> semester); Molecular Cell Biology II (2<sup>nd</sup> semester).
2. Applications are to be submitted to the Secretariat of the Dept. of Molecular Biology (H-1094 Budapest, Tűzoltó u. 37-47.) by July 10, 2026, at the latest. Applications will be evaluated and ranked by the Head of Department and forwarded to the Dean's Office within 10 business days of the application deadline.
3. Duties of teaching assistants: active participation and assistance in the practical teaching of the aforementioned courses (explaining the theoretical background of the experiments, providing technical assistance and supervising students during lab lessons, occasionally leading lab sessions independently under the tutor's supervision, and holding consultations). TAs must submit a detailed report on their activities to the head of the department by the end of the study period of the spring semester, which is a condition for the recognition of their TA activity as an elective subject in Neptun.
4. Teaching assistant positions cover both semesters of the 2026/27 academic year. The minimum working hours correspond to the duration of the laboratory sessions for the selected course but may not exceed 50 hours per month.
5. Teaching assistants receive a scholarship from the University.
6. Applicants for the teaching assistant position must meet the following criteria:
  - (i) have an overall grade point average of at least 4.00 in the previous academic year, i.e., the academic year 2025/26; (ii) have earned excellent (5) grades in the courses Medical Chemistry, and Molecular Cell Biology I and II; (iii) have been a registered student research fellow (TDK student) at the Department of Molecular Biology for at least one year.
