This subject aims to improve the knowledge of suturing and knotting to an advanced level by practicing new, special techniques. The practical skill training is based on theoretical lectures. This course is in English but is open to all three classes (Hungarian, English, and German).

Method of instruction (lecture, group work, practical lesson, etc.):

After theoretical lectures, the students can practice the suturing techniques individually or in a group of two under the personal guidance of the tutors.

Competencies acquired through completion of course:

Specific knowledge of preparation, stitches, suturing, and anastomosis techniques of the gastrointestinal tract and vessels.

Prerequisites for course registration and completion: (CODE):

The fulfillment of the mandatory course of 'Basic Surgical Techniques' is required.

Vessel anastomosis on ex vivo tissue (6x45 min.)
