How Applications are Assessed - What do you look at when assessing applications? What do you look for?

- UG degree in Healthcare Discipline or qualification/credits acceptable to the Programme Director
- English language requirements met or can come to pre-sessional English if not
- Evidence to support academic awards

Personal statement

A personal statement is not required.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

Students can only apply for a maximum of 50% of the total credits needed for the programme they are undertaking for example, the maximum credit gained through RPL for a Postgraduate Certificate would be 30 credits with the remaining 30 credits to be studied at the University of Dundee. The prior certificated learning must be relevant to the award to which it will contribute and demonstrate achievement of part of the Intended Learning Outcomes for the programme. The expectation is that the credit will normally have been acquired within the past five years.

Other Non-Academic Achievements/experiences - Is there anything else you look for in a potential student?

- Currently working in healthcare background
- Experience in teaching so can draw on personal experience or currently teaching (but not essential)

Interviews - Do you interview? What does the interview involve?

Offers - How long does it take to get offers out typically

Depending on when the application is received during the application period, it could be as little as a day or up to a week for ODL. For F2F - variable depending on Admissions.
