Objectives of the course, and its place in the curriculum of the medical training program:

The aim of the course is to provide students with consulting simulation practice training where students can carry out, complex patient examinations, determine diagnoses, prepare treatment plans, and carry out definitive therapies in prosthodontics, pediatric dentistry and orthodontics, cariology, endodontics and periodontology using their multidisciplinary knowledge.

Format of the course (lectures, group work, practical lessons, etc.):

Practice

Competencies acquired through completion of course:

Unassisted patient admission, establishment of general and dental medical history and recording of periodontology status. Thereafter, making a diagnosis, preparing and carrying out a treatment plan based on the diagnosis with a particular emphasis on conservative dentistry, endodontics and solo fixed dentures, pre-prosthetic preparation treatments, and causal periodontal therapy (supra- and subgingival mechanic cleaning, oral hygiene instruction, railing, extraction, elimination of plaque retention factors, periodontal post-treatment). In the areas of pediatric dentistry and orthodontics, prevention and early tooth loss along with the correct determination of the timing of orthodontics are discussed, as well as an overview of the differences between adult and pediatric dentistry services. Students work under the supervision of practical training instructors.

The four-week (120-hour) Summer practice in general dentistry can be completed by students primarily at the following organizational units of the Faculty: the Department of Community Dentistry, the Department of Prosthodontics, the Department of Pediatric Dentistry and Orthodontics, the Department of Conservative Dentistry and Endodontics, the Department of Oral Diagnostics and the Department of Periodontology.

Students can complete practical training in all dentistry specialty areas at the Department of Community Dentistry and the Department of Oral Diagnostics. Therefore, all required practical

training is fulfilled by students who apply for placements at these designated training sites.

Students applying to participate in “rotational training” complete two weeks of the four-week practical training at the Department of Prosthodontics or at the Department of Conservative Dentistry and Endodontics, and another two-week period at the Department of Pediatric Dentistry and Orthodontics or the Department of Periodontology, or divide the two weeks between these two institutions.

Students at the Faculty work six hours a day practicing the four-handed concept in such a way that half of the prescribed period is spent working as dentists and half working as chairside assistants.

No lectures are held on this subject. The practice sessions start with oral consultations to check students’ knowledge and discuss the tasks to be carried out. Under instructors’ supervision students treat patients in pairs (one carrying out the treatments, the other helping as an assistant), six hours a day, for four weeks. They plan the patient route as necessary and, at partner clinics or departments, they participate in associated oral medical treatment tasks. At the Periodontology Department, they acquire four-handed surgery assistance competencies and familiarize themselves with periodontal surgery interventions.

Requirements for attendance, options for making up missed sessions, and method of absence justification:

Attendance at practical sessions is mandatory. In order to complete the course, absences may not exceed 10% of the weekly practical sessions in any given week, even with a medical certificate.

According to faculty regulations, a total of 10% absence is permitted for the General Dentistry summer practice, which corresponds to 2 days. However, these 2 days may not fall within the same week. There is no possibility to make up missed sessions, and absences do not need to be justified. Any medical certificate submitted may be forwarded to the supervisory authority of the issuing healthcare institution for verification purposes.

Students must confirm their attendance by signing the attendance sheet at the beginning of each practical session.

Arriving more than 15 minutes late will be considered an absence and will be recorded by the

instructor on the attendance sheet. In such cases, the student may still attend the session on an optional basis. Three instances of lateness are considered equivalent to one absence.

Students are required to arrive prepared for the practical sessions. The instructor will assess both their level of preparation and the work completed through oral questioning.

Requirements for the successful completion of the course:

A minimum attendance of 90% is required for the practical sessions. Absences may not exceed 10% of the weekly practical sessions in any given week (which corresponds to 2 days, however, these 2 days may not fall within the same week).

A further condition for obtaining the signature for the summer practice is maintaining an adequate and consistent level of theoretical preparation, as well as demonstrating an appropriate level of practical performance.

The professional practice must be evaluated using a five-grade scale. In the case of an undivided practice completed at a single location, the completion of the practice and the final grade are recorded in the NEPTUN system by the course coordinator or a person authorized by them.

In the case of "rotational training," students' performance must be evaluated (graded) separately each week. These evaluations must be recorded on the attendance sheet and authenticated by the signature of the instructor.

The completion of the full professional practice and the final grade, determined based on the grades from the previous weeks, are recorded in the NEPTUN system by the instructor who supervised the student during the final week of the practice.

For students who completed their summer practice outside the Faculty, both the signature and the grade are recorded in the NEPTUN system by the competent staff member of the Dean's Office or the NHKK.
