**Call for Applications for Teaching Assistant Position

for Students of the Faculty of Medicine at Semmelweis University**

The Department of Vascular and Endovascular Surgery is announcing a call for applications for teaching assistant positions during the autumn and spring semesters of the academic year 2025/2026, linked to block teaching periods.

Application Requirements:

- being a student of the 3rd, 4th, or 5th year of the Faculty of Medicine
- committed to teaching the chosen subject and demonstrating exemplary behavior and attitude
- at least a good average academic result in the previous academic year
- above-the-average communication skills and foreign language proficiency (English and/or German)
- an active scientific student (TDK) work previously conducted at the Department of Vascular and Endovascular Surgery is an additional advantage

Expectations from a Teaching Assistant:

- Regular participation in the institute's practical teaching and preparation at least once or twice a week
- Regular preparation from the study material in order to effectively assist students and support the work of the practice instructors
- Participation in organizing and conducting demonstrations when necessary
- Accepting that all activities must comply with current data protection regulations and that all information, data, and documents obtained during the course of his/her duties must be treated confidentially and cannot be disclosed or made accessible to third parties

Teaching Assistant Workload:

32 hours/month, linked to block teaching

Students who are selected for teaching assistant positions will be assigned to experienced instructors. The appointed instructor/supervisor will regularly consult with the teaching assistant, support their professional and scientific development, provide direct professional guidance, and supervise their activities. Students awarded a demonstrator scholarship will receive remuneration determined by the Faculty of Medicine, based on the monthly performance report issued by the department.
