

Dear Students,

The practice of Oral surgery and dentistry in the first semester will follow a block education schedule. The practices date, educational week and personal form educational days for groups are summarised in the following table:

The students (in one-week block) are assigned into 3-4 subgroups (/1, /2, /3, /4, /5, /6). The assignment of the students into the subgroups is based on the registration in the Neptun system. The subgroups (minimum 5 students) conduct the one-week practice in the assigned Department. The practices are at this Department throughout the week.

The schedule of the small student groups is:

The practices will take place in two buildings of the University. The address of the Department of Oro-Maxillofacial Surgery and Stomatology/ Arc-Állcsont-Szájsebészeti és Fogászati Klinika is 52. Mária utca (street) Budapest 1085. The other Departments are in the Educational Center of the Faculty of Dentistry/ Fogorvostudományi Kar Oktatási Centrum (47. Szentkirályi utca (street), Budapest 1088).

Students should arrive around 07.45 at the building and collect their white coats from the cloakroom.

Location of the cloakroom in the Educational Center of the Faculty of Dentistry (47 Szentkirályi street, Budapest 1088): Ground floor, room No. 008 (on the right side of the lobby area).

Location of the cloakroom in the Department of Oro-Maxillofacial Surgery and Stomatology (52 Mária street): Basement, next to the lecture hall

Students should apply at 8 a.m. at the following locations in the assigned Department:

Fogászati és Szájsebészeti Oktató Intézet/Department of Community Dentistry: Educational Center of Faculty of Dentistry, 47 Szentkirályi street, Budapest 1088, in front of the Árkövy lecture hall's door.

In the Department of Community Dentistry, the practice will take place in different units for subgroups. The students receive information about the exact location of the practice area for subgroups within the building at the beginning of the practice.

Students' presence sheets are kept to track attendance. Participation is mandatory in 90% of the practices. A prerequisite for taking the test is a minimum of 90% course participation, which the departments must verify.

The missing educational day can be made up. The application for the make-up practice can be submitted in person at the Secretariat of the Department of Oro-Maxillofacial Surgery and Stomatology or by email (titkarsag.arcallcsont@semmelweis.hu).

An online seminar is scheduled to take place on Friday. During the online seminar, lectures are presented about the subfield of dentistry (primary diseases, main symptoms, diagnosis, and treatment). The lectures are available on the E-learning interface. Viewing online seminar lectures is mandatory for completing the subject. An online presence sheet registers the viewing.

The exam registration takes place on the Neptun system during the given educational week from 2 pm on Monday to 12 pm on Thursday. It is the student's responsibility to register for the exam.

The exam consists of two parts, a simple-choice test and an OSCE practical assignment. Both parts of the exam take place through the E-learning interface on Friday from 2 pm. to 4 pm. The grade is based on the results of the test exam. The result of the OSCE practical part does not contribute to the grade, but without completing the OSCE part, the exam is not considered successful. The OSCE part is considered successful, with the minimum points earned during this part.

The test part consists of 50 simple-choice questions to be answered within 60 minutes. The test questions will be based on the material from the online seminar. After completing the test, your

score and grade will be visible on the exam platform. The tests are evaluated and grades determined as follows: 45-50 points is excellent, 40-44 points is good, 35-39 is average, 30-34 is sufficient, and below 29 is insufficient.

The assignment of the OSCE practical part is also available on Moodle platform. The OSCE part includes a medical situation and a series of simple-choice and multiple-choice questions related to the scenario. The OSCE part is available for 30 minutes. The OSCE part is considered successful if the minimum points (3 points) are earned. The points of the OSCE part do not contribute to the grade, but without completing the OSCE part, the exam is not considered successful.

Other study materials are available on the E-learning platform. Registration for the E-Learning Platform and access to the internet are the responsibility of the student.

Any changes relating to practices or study materials are notified through either the Neptun system or E-learning. However, the follow-up and timely receipt of Neptun or E-learning messages are the responsibility of the students.
