The process of the exam:

- The written and the oral part can be attended independently, but the prerequisite of a successfully passed exam is the passing of both parts of the exam. Candidates are allowed to use printed dictionaries in the written part.
- The chosen language of the exam is independent of the language of the state-accredited B2 language exam which is also criterion.
- Exemption from the University Elementary Exam is only possible in case candidates have passed a professional language exam accredited on a state or international level.
- the Department of Languages for Specific Purposes is responsible for exemptions
