Requirements for participation in classes and the possibility to make up for absences:
Attendance of lessons is obligatory. Students are allowed to have seven absences per semester. Students who miss a class can make up for it (twice a semester). A medical certificate for long-term sickness or hospitalization is required if students are absent more than 7 times.

## Methods to assess knowledge acquisition during term time:

## Requirements for signature:

Method and type of evaluation:
The practical grade is given based on the average of the two oral interviews. At least $50 \%$ must be achieved in both interviews. Active work in classes also affects the mark.

$60-74 \%=$ medium (3)
$75 \%-89 \%=\operatorname{good}(4)$
