| Speaking | 1. spontaneous conversation with the examiner about predefined professional medical <br> topics <br> 2. by Hungarian instructions, the description of the treatmet of a given patient or the presentation of <br> his or her patient journey, after a 1 min preparation time (based on pre-defined treatment guidelines <br> and patient journeys) <br> 3. by Hungarian instructions, simulated dialogue of a simple medical situation, after 1 minute <br> preparation time (specialist / specialist and specialist / client dialogue on pre-defined topics) |

- The University Professional Basic Examination can only be replaced by a state or internationally recognized Professional Medical Examination of at least elementary level
- The determination of exemption from the University Professional Basic Examination is in the scope of the Department of Languages for Specific Purposes
