Objectives of the subject, its place in the medical curriculum: The aim of the course is to extend students' medical terminology by going through the main fields of medicine and by getting acquainted with the names of conditions, symptoms, and anatomical structures. Students develop a more advanced terminological knowledge not only by learning new Latin phrases or Greek combining forms, but also by improving their skills in interpreting medical terms with the help of etymological notes and word formation rules and conventions. The lessons provide students with opportunities to develop a more conscious use of the anatomical nomenclature and diagnostic language as well as to better understand clinical documents.
