They will be required to give an account of their knowledge and obtain a term grade in AOKNYE906_2N by the end of the semester at a date arranged with the instructor.

Related subjects due to interdisciplinary fields (both compulsory and elective) and potential overlaps between subjects: --

Attendance requirements; conditions under which students can make up for absences and the method of absence justification:
A maximum of 7 absences is allowed ( 7 x 90 minutes, i.e., 14 x 45 minutes); if the number of absences exceeds this, the student may make up missed classes in another group (maximum two times) in agreement with the instructor.
A student who misses more than $25 \%$ of the practical classes will not be allowed to get a signature (Study and Examination Regulations §29). For more than the allowed number of absences, a medical certificate of long-term illness or hospitalization is required.
According to the Study and Examination Regulations (§ 28), three tardies count as one absence.
Arriving 15 minutes later than the start of the lesson is considered tardiness.

## Method and type of grading:

The average of the oral tests (including the test(s) for an upgrade) is the basis for the final semester grade, which may be modified by the assessment of class work.
