<p><b>The goals and place of the course in regards to the education of dental students:</b> During the course, students will be introduced to dental situations, which include several written and spoken text types of dental communication.</p>
<p><b>Location of the course (address of lecture hall, seminar room etc.):</b> Department of Languages for Specific Purposes, Budapest 1094, Ferenc tér 15.</p>
<p><b>Competencies acquired by completion of the course:</b> <b>Comprehension and speaking skills:</b> Students can</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• understand and answer questions in the dentist's office;</li><li>• present a simple dentist-patient conversation, answer questions in topics (root canal treatment, calculus, orthodontics, as well as surgeries, medications, fainting, allergies, etc.), speak independently.</li></ul> <p><b>Reading skills:</b> students can understand longer texts using the vocabulary learned; in the case of texts that contain some unfamiliar words, infer the meaning <b>Writing skills:</b> students can write longer texts based on a question or a topic</p>

**Method of course registration:** via the Neptun system

**Detailed course/lecture description:**

**Week 1.** Revision: tooth, tooth brushing, tooth decay, fillings, DMF, questions in history-taking, questions about pain, complaint, etc.

**Week 2.** Revision: sentences required by the Faculty of Dentistry (parts 1-5)

**Week 3.** Revision: Questionnaire to assess general health

(Guided) situations to enhance comprehension; new strategies

Sentences required by the Faculty of Dentistry 6. (vocabulary in connection with impression taking)

**Week 4.** Situations, dentist-patient dialogues

Sentences required by the Faculty of Dentistry 7. (changing filling, light-binding filling, etc.)

**Week 5.** Dialogue based on X-ray imaging (e.g., the filling does not seal properly)

Sentences required by the Faculty of Dentistry 8. (tooth extraction, removing suture, etc.)

**Week 6.** Sentences required by the Faculty of Dentistry 9-10. (tooth color, rocking dentures, rub the gums, etc.)

Revision: treatment documentation, steps of medical treatment

**Week 7.** Revision, oral test. Mock comprehensive exam based on the sentences required by the Faculty of Dentistry 1-10

**Week 8.** Instruments in the sentences required by the Faculty of Dentistry (11-12). Presenting the objects needed for dental treatment (saliva ejector, mask, Lidocaine with long/short needle, upper left molar forceps, dental bibs, dental dam clamp, etc.) Sentences like 'Can I have a ...?'

New topic: calculus

**Week 9.** Sentences required by the Faculty of Dentistry 13-14.

Revision of previous topics (tooth, tooth brushing, tooth decay, fillings, gingivitis)

New topic: root canal treatment (its meaning, steps of the treatment, tools used during the procedure, etc.)

**Week 10.** Sentences for the comprehensive exam in conservative dentistry

New topic: orthodontics

**Week 11.** Sentences required by the Faculty of Dentistry: please + imperative verb, with grammatical explanations (e.g., please keep away..., please help..., please mix...)

**Week 12.** Filling out a form based on a heard text + DMF (revision)

Revision: topics for the comprehensive exam, sentences required by the Faculty of Dentistry, history taking, treatment

**Week 13.** Revision

**Week 14.** Oral test

**Special academic work required for completion of the course: ---**

**Attendance on practices and lectures, replacement in case of missed sessions:**

A maximum of 7 absences is allowed; if the number of absences exceeds this, students may make up missed classes in another group (maximum two times) in agreement with the instructor. Students who miss more than 25% of the classes will not be allowed to get a signature. For more than the allowed number of absences, a medical certificate of long-term illness or hospitalization is required.

**Method of checking acquired knowledge during the study period:**

Two oral tests in weeks 7 and 14

Topic: the material covered

make-up and upgrade opportunities: to be arranged outside of class with the instructor.

**Requirements of an accepted semester (*signature of the lecturer*):**

A maximum of 7 absences is allowed; if the number of absences exceeds this, students may make up missed classes in another class (maximum two times) in agreement with the instructor. Students who miss more than 25% of the classes will not be allowed to get a signature; attendance in classes; attendance in both oral tests.

<b>Requirements of the exam: ---</b>
<b>Grading of courses:</b> Students will receive a term grade based on the average of their oral tests and their class work. The second oral test is marked by two teachers on separate mark sheets and an average is calculated. An unsatisfactory oral test must be repeated – the ‘fail’ (1) grade for these students will also count towards the end-of-term grade. Assessment of oral tests: 0-49% = fail (1) 50-59% = pass (2) 60-74% = fair (3) 75-89% = good (4) 90-100% = excellent (5)
