Action plan based on the student feedback received in the 1st semester of the 2025/2026 academic year

Department: Traumatology

Faculty: Medicine

Our feedback on general comments by the students:

The Traumatology Department received 56 completed student questionnaires (38.1%) from the English language students in the 1st semester of the 2024/2025 academic year through Neptun Unipoll system concerning feedback of the subject and 10 incomplete questionnaires (6.8%). More than half of the feedback was above the faculty average, and the rest was in line with it.

The Traumatology Department received the following comments from English language students in the 1st semester of the 2025/2026 academic year through Neptun Unipoll system concerning the general comments by the students:

- „Dr. Tomas did an amazing job teaching us, the explanations were clear, the atmosphere was relaxed and supportive, and it really helped us learn and feel comfortable asking questions. The other doctors were also great and contributed a lot to making the sessions enjoyable and useful. Overall, the block felt really well organized and well taught. The only thing that was a bit challenging was the amount of material on Moodle compared to the short time we have for this block it felt a little overwhelming to get through everything properly. Otherwise the experience was really positive and I genuinely appreciated the teaching.”
 - We are going to look into adjusting the Moodle material to make it more manageable within the block’s timeframe.

- “I had such a great time in this lecture and learned so much. I didn't get to observe a surgery, so maybe that is my o my feedback.”
 - We will explore ways to provide more opportunities for observing surgeries in the future.
- „I think trauma and orthopedics should be evaluated separately”
 - As the Orthopedics and Trauma Clinic will officially unify on the 1st of May, the block will continue to be taught and evaluated as a single subject from that point onward.
- “more patient interactions”
 - We will aim to provide more opportunities for patient interactions during the block to enhance the learning experience.

Regarding the special questionnaire on feedback for the block schedule, the Traumatology Department received the following ratings from English-language students in the 1st semester of the 2025/2026 academic year via the Neptun Unipoll system.

- K1: How would you rate the instructors’/practical supervisors’ teaching skills (explanations, responsiveness to questions, interactivity, group discussions)?
 - Department of Traumatology received a 9.68 compared to the average of 9.50 of the faculty.
- K2: How regularly did the instructors/practical supervisors use learning support tools (e.g., PPT, Moodle, O365, Kaltura, digital materials, role-playing, simulated exercises, group tasks, case-based approach)?
 - Department of Traumatology received a 9.36 compared to the average of 9.33 of the faculty.
- K3: How would you evaluate the instructors’ preparedness for lessons?
 - Department of Traumatology received a 9.59 compared to the average of 9.52 of the faculty.
- K4: How effectively did the instructors use the time available to them?
 - Department of Traumatology received a 9.71 compared to the average of 9.41 of the faculty.
- K5: Were there sufficient opportunities to practice patient examinations and improve communication skills?
 - Department of Traumatology received a 9.64 compared to the average of 9.22 of the faculty.

- K6: How much did the practical training help in preparing for exams?
 - Department of Traumatology received a 9.75 compared to the average of 9.28 of the faculty.
- K7: Overall, how would you evaluate the block-based teaching?
 - Department of Traumatology received a 9.62 compared to the average of 9.36 of the faculty.
